## Workshop Description

This two day workshop is designed for pediatric occupational and physical therapists. The content will include the theoretical principles and treatment approaches of sensory integration (SI) and Neurodevelopmental treatment (NDT). This course will compare and contrast these frames of reference via lecture, group problem solving and labs including facilitation and use of therapeutic equipment. Participants will learn to apply these techniques to maximize functional performance in their clients with neuro-motor and sensory impairments.

## Course Objectives

*Upon completion of this workshop, participants will be able to:*

- 1) Identify 3 key concepts of sensory motor development and it's influence on function.
- 2) Indicate the underlying neurological principles effecting postural mechanisms.
- 3) Demonstrate treatment activities that highlight similarities and differences between Sensory Integration and NDT treatment approaches.
- 4) Apply the concepts presented in this workshop to children, implementing sensory strategies or handling that will help the client benefit from treatment.
- 5) Select functional outcomes of SI and NDT.
- 6) Apply SI and NDT treatment principles for children who have neuromotor and sensory processing disorders.
